

This ROAR encompasses the University of Connecticut Avery Point regional campus, an academic, cultural, and economic resource for the City of Groton, as well as the roads and beaches along Eastern Point. This area is characterized by moderate-to-high heat and flood vulnerability, including a potential access risk related to Shennecossett Road, which lies partially in the 100-year floodplain. Eastern Point Beach is City-owned, and the Avery Point waterfront is open to the public. The City of Groton Community Resilience Plan notes the presence of three critical pump stations in this neighborhood as well as other infrastructure assets and transit stops, categorizing the area as having a high level of critical facility and infrastructure vulnerability.

<p>Este ROAR abarca el campus regional de la Universidad de Connecticut en Avery Point, un recurso académico, cultural y económico para la ciudad de Groton, así como las carreteras y playas a lo largo de Eastern Point. Esta área se caracteriza por el calor moderado a alto y la vulnerabilidad a las inundaciones, incluido un riesgo potencial de acceso relacionado con Shennecossett Road, que se encuentra parcialmente en la llanura aluvial de 100 años. Eastern Point Beach es propiedad de la ciudad, y el paseo marítimo de Avery Point está abierto al público. El Plan de Resiliencia Comunitaria de la Ciudad de Groton señala la presencia de tres estaciones de bombeo críticas en este vecindario, así como otros activos de infraestructura y paradas de tránsito, categorizando el área como con un alto nivel de vulnerabilidad crítica de instalaciones e infraestructura.</p>
