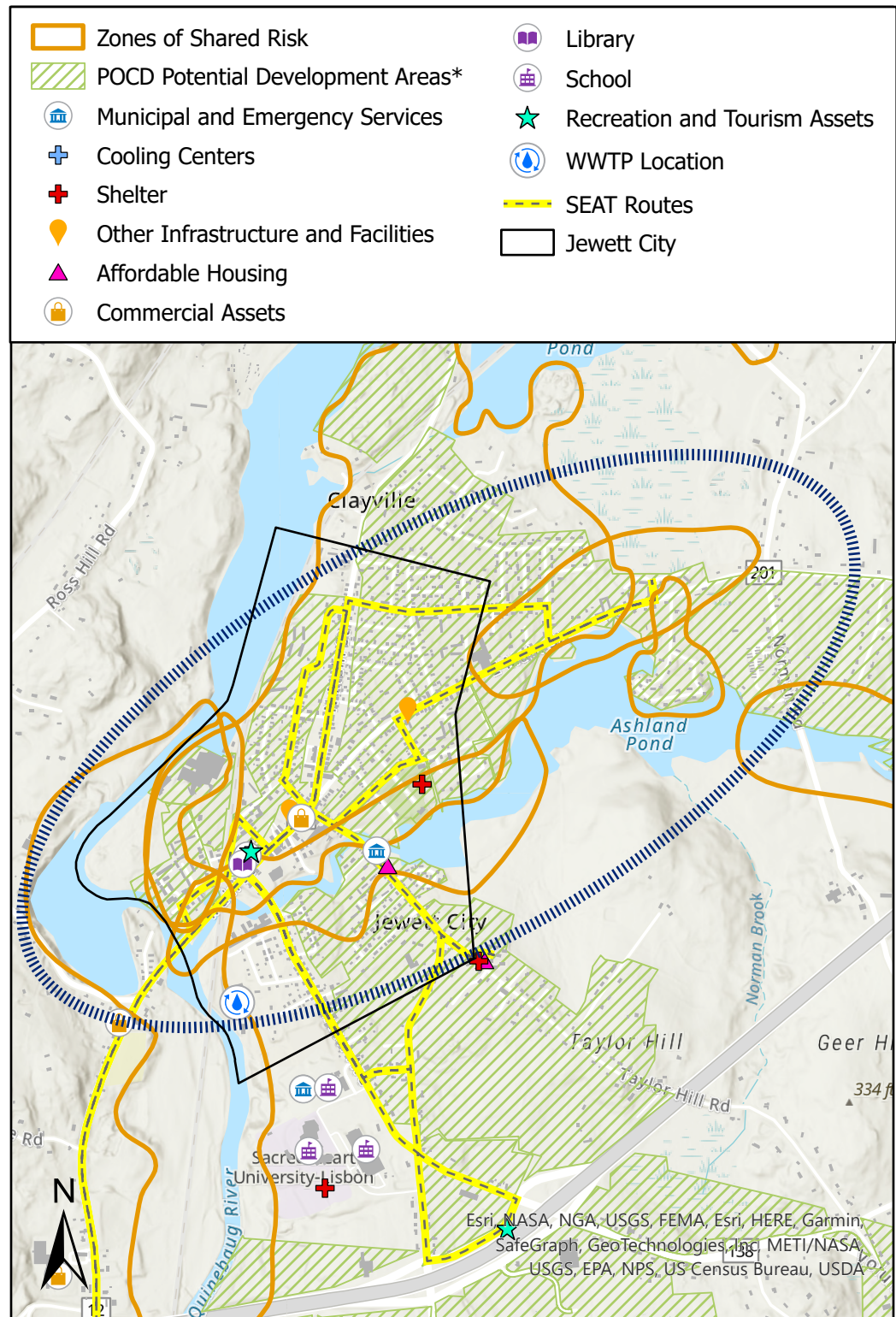

Jewett City is an environmental justice community with relatively high social vulnerability. Flooding of the Quinebaug River and Patchaug River caused inundation in Jewett City during the severe flood event of March 2010. During this flood, the Jewett City and Griswold wastewater treatment plant was inundated and service was disrupted. Since then, several close calls have occurred, including the flood of September 2022. The Town and Borough are concerned with risks in Jewett City increasing over time. In particular, a sewer pumping station and numerous condominium units off South Main Street were flooded during the storm of 2010. The Town and Borough have considered acquisitions and elevations in this area. Extreme heat management is a concern in Jewett City. The senior center and the library have been opened as cooling centers in the past. The senior center was moved to Taylor Hill Road, south of the Patchaug River relative to the borough. The former senior center building on Soule Street may become a school, but potentially could serve as a backup cooling center, and has the benefit of location on the north side the Patchaug River within the population center of the borough.

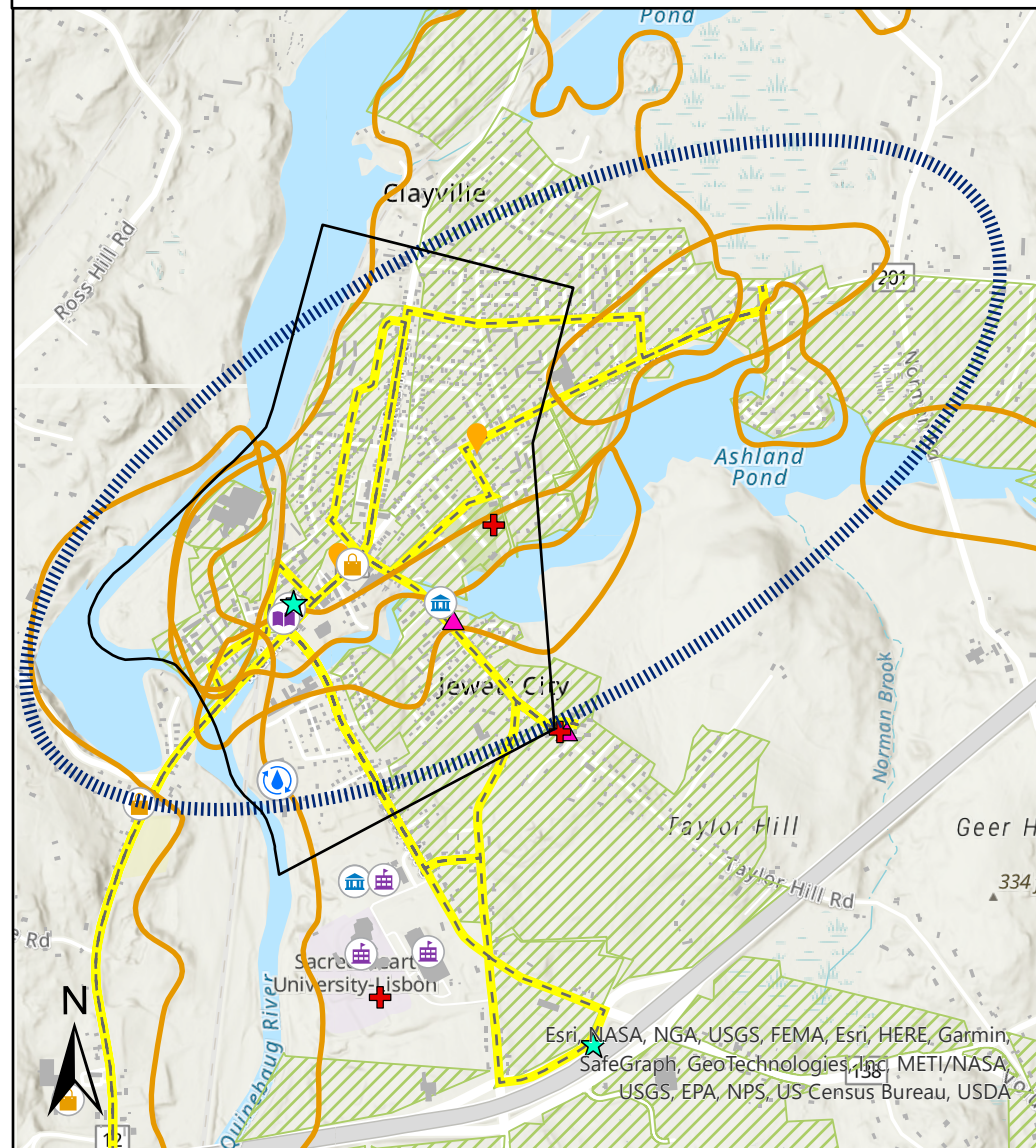

Jewett City es una comunidad de justicia ambiental con una vulnerabilidad social relativamente alta. Las inundaciones de los ríos Quinebaug y Patchaug causaron inundaciones en la ciudad de Jewett durante la grave inundación de marzo de 2010. Durante esta inundación, la planta de tratamiento de aguas residuales de Jewett City y Griswold se inundó y el servicio se interrumpió. Desde entonces, se han producido varios momentos cercanos, incluida la inundación de septiembre de 2022. La ciudad y el municipio están preocupados por los riesgos que aumentan con el tiempo en Jewett City. En particular, una estación de bombeo de alcantarillado y numerosas unidades de condominio cerca de South Main Street se inundaron durante la tormenta de 2010. La ciudad y el municipio han considerado adquisiciones y elevaciones en esta área. El manejo del calor extremo es una preocupación en Jewett City. El centro para personas mayores y la biblioteca se han abierto como centros de enfriamiento en el pasado. El centro para personas mayores se trasladó a Taylor Hill Road, al sur del río Patchaug en relación con el municipio. El antiguo edificio del centro para personas mayores en la calle Soule puede convertirse en una escuela, pero potencialmente podría servir como un centro de enfriamiento de respaldo, y tiene el beneficio de estar ubicado en el lado norte del río Patchaug dentro del centro de población del municipio.
