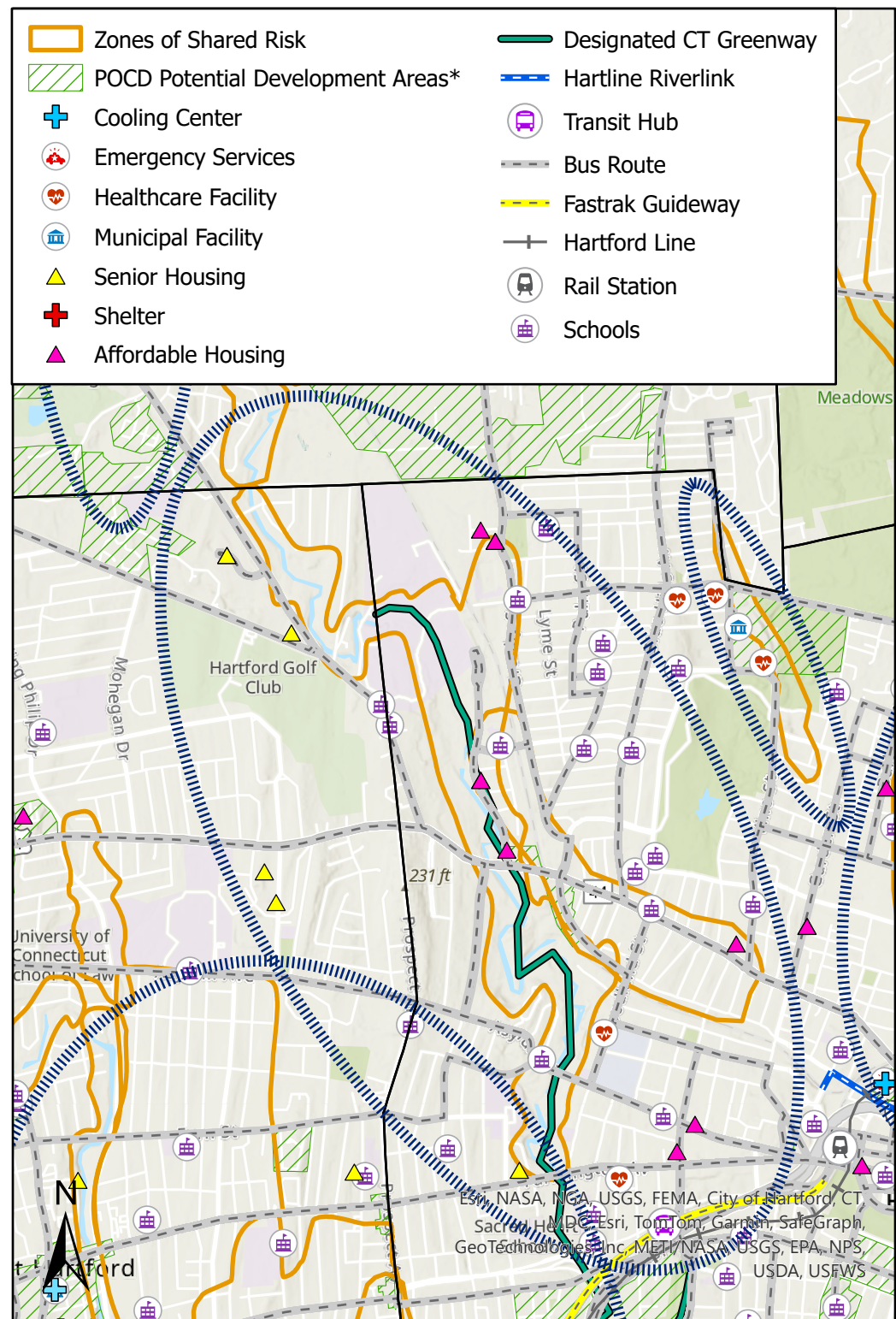

The Park River is a tributary of the Connecticut River that crosses municipal boundaries and includes both north and south branches. Multiple housing and educational facilities are located along the length of the North Branch, including the University of Hartford and the University of Connecticut Law School. The wider area is characterized by high flood, heat, and social vulnerability. In addition to the critical facilities and community assets listed below, there are also nearly 20 educational facilities located within this ROAR. There is an established watershed stewardship group dedicated to the Park River working actively in the region.

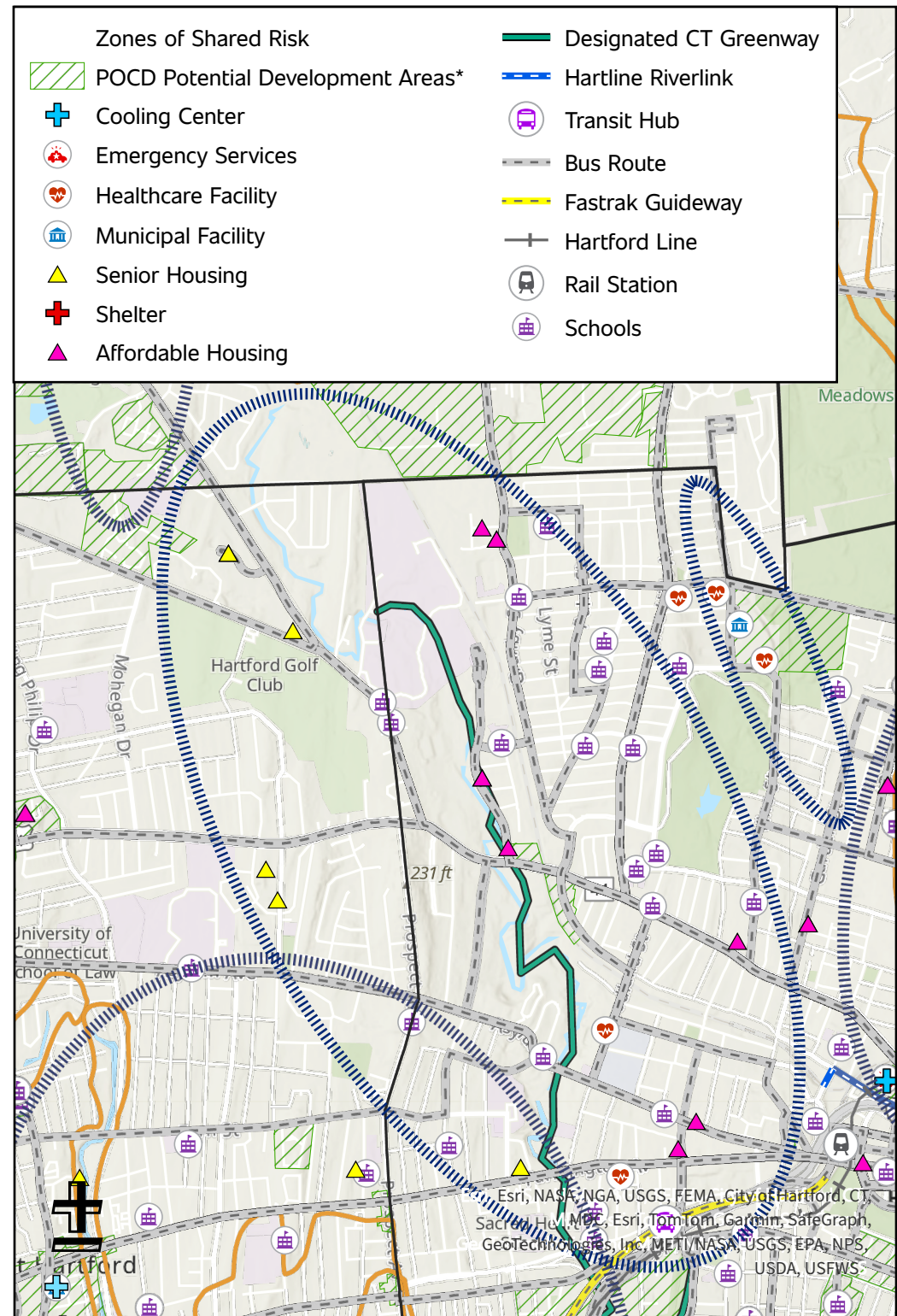

El río Park es un afluente del río Connecticut que cruza los límites municipales e incluye ramas norte y sur. Múltiples instalaciones de vivienda y educación se encuentran a lo largo de la rama norte, incluyendo la Universidad de Hartford y la Facultad de Derecho de la Universidad de Connecticut. El área más amplia se caracteriza por altas inundaciones, calor y vulnerabilidad social. Además de las instalaciones esenciales y los bienes comunitarios que se enumeran a continuación, hay cerca de 20 centros educativos ubicados dentro de este informe anual orientado hacia los resultados. Hay un grupo establecido de administración de cuencas hidrográficas dedicado al río Park que trabaja activamente en la región.
