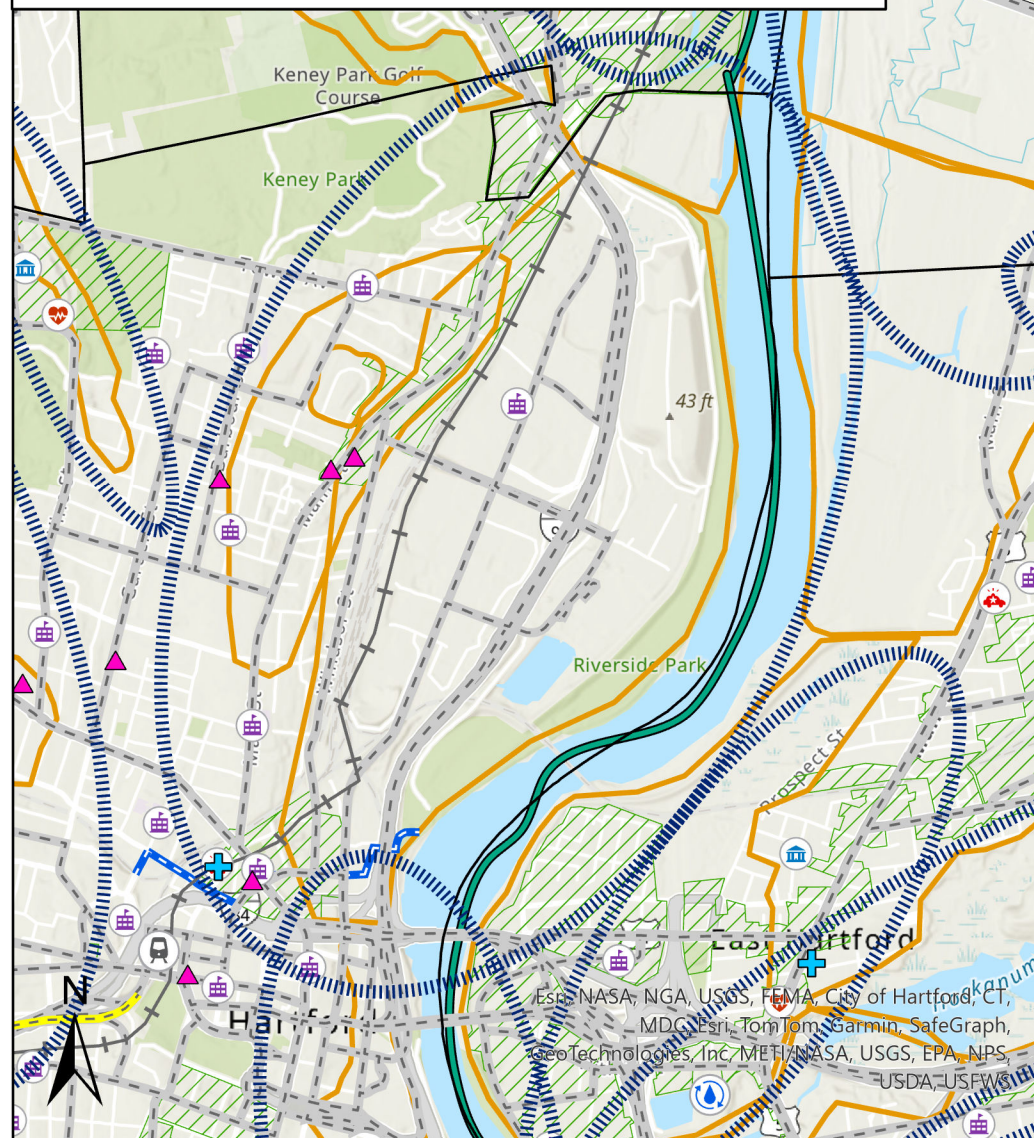
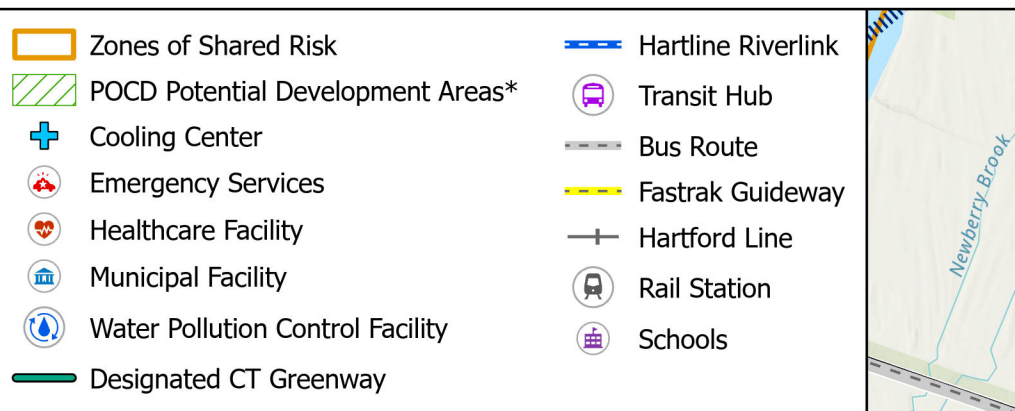

Northeast Hartford, adjacent to the Connecticut River, is characterized by high flood, heat, and social vulnerability. Socioeconomic factors contribute to a lack of adaptive capacity here, and multiple schools and affordable housing units within this ROAR add to the potential social vulnerability. A high level of impervious surfaces contribute to both flood and heat vulnerability, although proximity to the more-forested areas of Keney Park and Riverside Park offers some respite.
